- 1 The number of American women working or seeking employment has grown steadily since the middle of the last century. The tide of female workers including all ages and backgrounds has been sweeping the country, with various consequences. One hardly needs to mention the economic effect of **their** activities, since more than fifty per cent of families are now living on two incomes. But the most striking effect of women's new role is of a social nature. It touches family life, the number of children, the relation between parents and children and between men and women.
- 2 In the past, young girls got married for romantic reasons. Most of them regarded marriage as their only chance to gain independence from their parents, to have a provider, or to be assured of a good place in society. This is rarely the case today. Since she is probably working and supporting herself, a young woman is free to marry only when and if she chooses. As a consequence, today's American women tend to marry later in life.
- 3 The new role that women have developed for themselves has transformed family life. The modern couple has fewer children than the former generation. The relation between husband and wife is changing, too. More and more husbands are sharing the burden at home and willingly taking on chores that their fathers would have rejected as unmanly. **In such cases** men and women become equal partners, both working outside, both doing the housework. However, even if equal partnership is a fact, it does not always work well. The marriage can collapse when the wife is more successful in her profession than her husband is in his, particularly when she earns more than he does or when the husband tries to benefit from his wife's salary and still has the traditional role as the master at home.
- 4 Among all the changes resulting from the massive entry of women into the work force, the transformation that has occurred in women themselves is not the least important. They see themselves in a new light, for they have discovered that they can do just as well as men in any profession. Women have gained pride, self-confidence and independence. Have they gained happiness? The answer would vary from a working woman to another. Many women are too exhausted by their double career to enjoy either **one**. Many feel guilty about leaving their children to the care of strangers, about neglecting all the small things that a non-working homemaker does for her family and house. For women, taking a profession involves sacrifices – they have to make a difficult choice. Perhaps the real progress is that the choice perhaps exists; in their grandmother's time it didn't.
