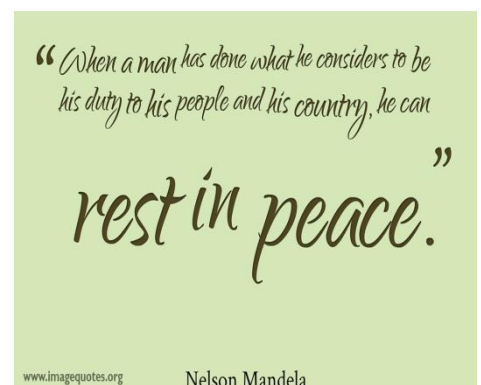

Respect is one of the most important bases when living in a society. We all have freedom, but it is restricted to a certain point. We cannot consider a killer or a thief good citizens as they have violated that restriction.
- 5 These are some of the ideas that I think are the most important aspects for being good citizens within a community. Nowadays the relationships between people have been really deteriorated by misunderstandings that are generated day by day. To avoid having to deal with these negative situations, we have to be aware that the solution depends on us. Therefore, we have to be aware of our rights and obligations.
